Description

A summarative experience covering comprehensive, assessment-based patient care management for the paramedic level. Includes specific care when dealing with pediatric, adult, geriatric, and special-needs patients. At the completion of this module, the student will be able to integrate pathophysiological principles and assessment findings to formulate a field impression, and implement a treatment plan for patients with common complaints.

Criminal Background

Statutory requirement to notify applicants and enrollees of potential ineligibility for an occupational license due to conviction of an offense Statutory authority: HB1508, effective September 1, 2017, amended Texas Occupations Code, Chapter 53, to require notice regarding the consequences of a criminal conviction on eligibility for an occupational license. Who must give notification: If your institution provides an educational program to prepare an individual for issuance of an initial occupational license, you

must provide notification. An "occupational license" is a license, certificate, registration, permit, or other form of authorization required by law or rule that must be obtained by an individual to engage in a particular business or occupation. Who must receive notification: Each applicant to and enrollee in an educational program which prepares an individual for issuance of an initial occupational license must be notified regarding potential ineligibility. The notification requirement applies for enrollees and applicants on or after September 1, 2017. The notification must be given to each applicant and enrollee regardless of whether they have been convicted of an offense. Required notification: Notification to program enrollees and applicants must include: 1. The potential ineligibility of an individual who has been convicted of an offense for issuance of an occupational license on completion of the educational program; 2. The current guidelines issued by the applicable licensing authority (See, Texas Occupations Code, Sec. 53.025). In particular, the licensing authority's guidelines must state the reasons a particular crime is considered to relate to a particular license and any other criterion that affects the decisions of the licensing authority. A "licensing authority" is a state agency or political subdivision that issues an occupational license; 3. Any other state or local restriction or guideline used by the licensing authority to determine the eligibility of an individual who has been convicted of an offense for an occupational license issued by the licensing authority; and 4. The right of an individual to request a criminal history evaluation letter (See, Texas Occupations Code, Sec. 53.102). An individual may request a licensing authority to issue a criminal history evaluation letter regarding the person's eligibility for a license issued by that authority if the person: (1) is enrolled or planning to enroll in an educational program that prepares a person for an initial license or is planning to take an examination for an initial license; and (2) has reason to believe that the person is ineligible for the license due to a conviction or deferred adjudication for a felony or misdemeanor offense. The request must state the basis for the person's potential ineligibility. Conditions and result of failure to provide notice: Your institution may be subject to ordered refunds and payments if: • Your institution is regulated by a licensing authority; and • The licensing authority determines that your institution has failed to provide the above notice to an individual entitled to the notice; and • The individual's application for an occupational license for which your institution prepared the individual was denied because the individual had been convicted of an offense. The licensing authority shall order your institution to: 1. Refund the amount of any tuition paid by the individual to your institution; and 2. Pay to the individual an amount equal to the total of the following, as applicable: (A) The amount of any application fees paid by the individual to the licensing authority; and (B) The amount of any examination fees paid by the individual to the licensing authority or an examination provider approved by the licensing authority. Best practices: • Your institution should provide notices to enrollees and applicants for each educational program which prepares an individual for issuance of an initial occupational license. Because guidelines will vary based on the licensing authority which issues the occupational license, notices may also vary between educational programs. • Your institution should familiarize program staff with the current guidelines issued by the applicable licensing authority for each program which prepares an individual for issuance of an initial occupational license. Familiarization will assist program staff in ensuring the correct notice is provided to enrollees and applicants. • Your institution should have a means of documenting provision and receipt of notice to enrollees and applicants.
